Mission

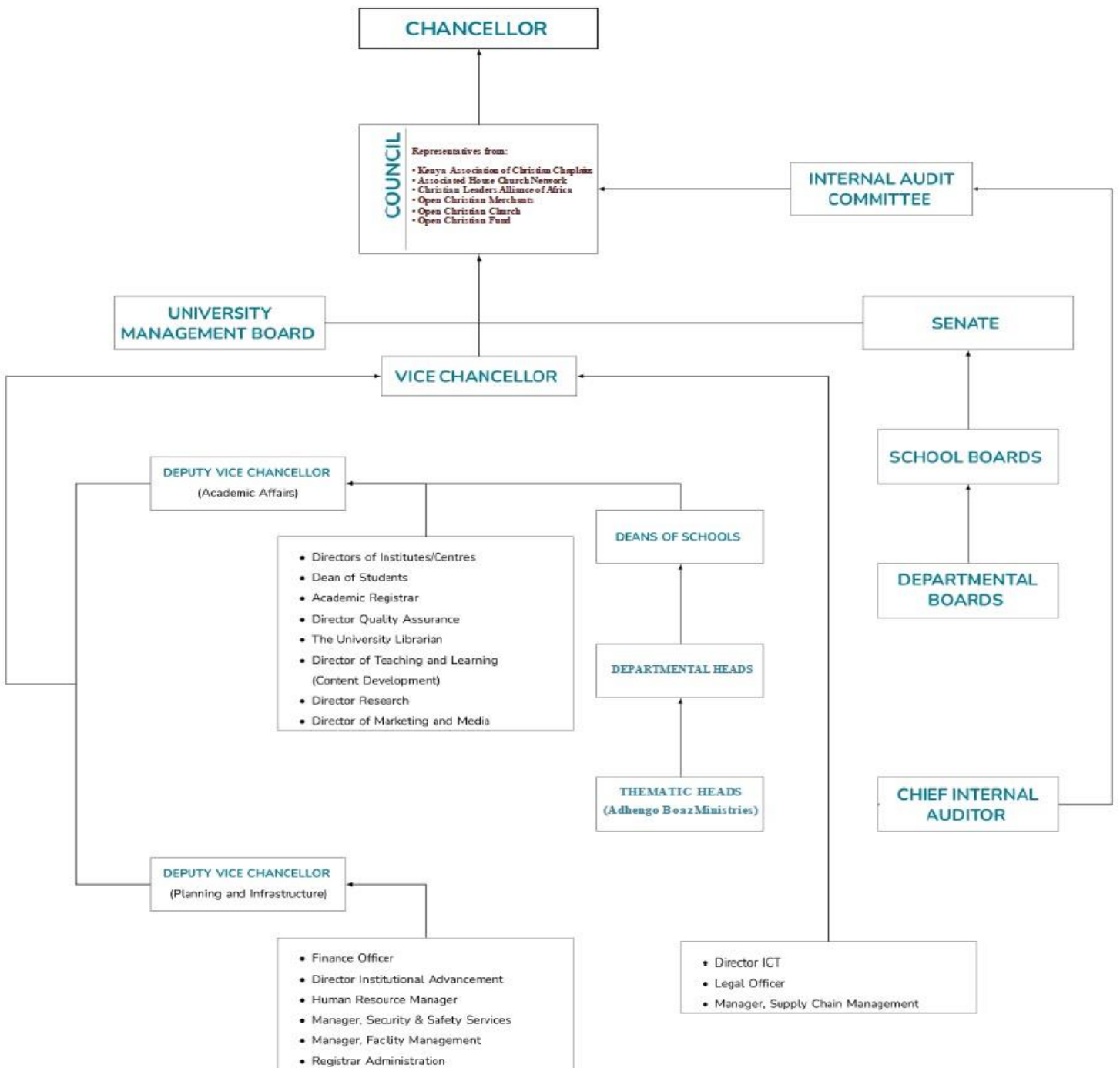
To educate Christ-centred leaders for the transformation of God's people and world through innovative programmes, research, and community engagement.

Each constituent entity is to develop its own curriculum philosophy, which would be related to the University philosophy and relevant to the entity's distinctive purpose. ACADEMIC STANDARDS AND POLICIES

ADMISSIONS

General Admission Requirements

Open Christian University of Eastern Africa (OCUEA) adheres to a non-discrimination policy in admissions. This is an expression of a foundational value rooted in our university's Christian teaching. All persons are invited to apply and will be given equal opportunity for admission regardless of race, gender, handicap, ethnic background, marital status, or national origin. Open Christian University of Eastern Africa is a private Christian university and all programmes and functions of the university are explicitly Christian in worldview and values. The programmes in the School of Theology are designed with specific Church-based and Church-related vocational outcomes in view. Programmes in this School prepare leaders for service within the Christian tradition. Thus because of the specific mission of the School of Theology, individuals seeking admission to the degree programmes in this School must declare that they are adherents of the Christian faith. Other schools within the university do not require such a profession of Christian faith, but do require that an applicant acknowledges the Christian values and ethos of the university community and agree to abide by the Community Covenant printed in the Student Handbook.

All applications towards OCUEA programmes must be submitted in the prescribed form, which must be completed and signed by the applicant. All requirements must be submitted as summarized on the checklist section of the form. Where a Grade Point Average (GPA) is cited in this document, it is out of a 4.0 scale.

UNDERGRADUATE PROGRAMS

Certificate Programmes

All applicants to the University Certificate programmes shall meet the following minimum academic requirements:

- Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (CSE) Mean Grade D (minus) or its Accredited and Recognized equivalent
- The Kenya Certificate of Education (KCE), East African Certificate of Education (EACE), "Ordinary Level" Division III

Diploma Programmes

All applicants to the University diploma programmes shall meet the following minimum academic requirements:

- Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education (KCSE) Mean Grade C (minus) or its Accredited and Recognized equivalent OR
- KCSE Mean Grade D (minus) or its Accredited and Recognized equivalent with Recognized relevant Post-Secondary Certificate, OR
- The Kenya Certificate of Education (KCE), East African Certificate of Education (EACE), "Ordinary Level" Division I or II or an Accredited and Recognized equivalent, OR
- The Kenya Certificate of Education (KCE), East African Certificate of Education (EACE), "Ordinary Level" Division III or an Accredited and Recognized equivalent, plus an Accredited and Recognized Post-Secondary Certificate, OR
- The Kenya Advanced Certificate of Education (KACE) "Advanced Level" with at least one Principal pass and a subsidiary.

Bachelor's Degree Programmes

Admission into a bachelor's degree program at Open Christian University of Eastern Africa, will be based on the following minimum requirements:

- a. The minimum requirement of Grade C+ must be attained at the Kenya Certificate of Secondary Examination (KCSE) or its equivalent and additional requirements specified for each academic program,
- b. Applicants with relevant diploma from an institution recognized by the University Senate.

Postgraduate Programs

Admission and conduct of postgraduate programs shall be conducted under the provisions of the general postgraduate regulations.

Postgraduate Diploma

The following shall be eligible for admission into a postgraduate diploma program in the University:

- Holders of a Bachelor's degree from Open Christian University of Eastern Africa and other universities recognized by the OCUEA Senate with a Pass level of classification or a minimum GPA of 2.5 or its equivalent.

The postgraduate diploma programs in all schools shall extend over a period of at least 12 months from the date of registration and a maximum of 24 months.

Masters Programs

The following shall be eligible for admission into a Masters degree program in the University:

- Holders of a Bachelor's degree (Second Class Honours [Upper Division] or higher) from Open Christian University - East Africa or other universities recognized by the OCUEA Senate,
- Holders of a Bachelor's degree (Second Class Honours [Lower Division]) from Open Christian University - East Africa or other recognized universities who have at least two years of relevant post-graduation experience,
- Holders of a postgraduate diploma from OCUEA or other institutions recognized by the OCUEA Senate, with a minimum GPA of 2.5 or its equivalent
- In exceptional cases, Senate, on the recommendation of any of the schools, may admit to the Masters program, applicants who do not hold a first degree, provided that such candidates, based on the research and academic work they have done, can demonstrate that they are well qualified to undertake postgraduate work. This is so long as it is in line with the relevant regulatory bodies.

Application for Admission

- I. The applicant shall complete the application form and submit full documentation for all academic qualifications, such as copies of previous certificates and official transcripts from the earlier colleges or universities attended. The respective college or university, submitted in an email by the issuing college or university must have issued the official transcript. Certified copies of transcripts may be accepted in lieu of the

official transcript. Transcripts and certificates written in a language other than English must be submitted with a certified translation into English.

- II. Qualified applicants shall receive a letter of acceptance from OCUEA Admissions Office before enrolment at the university; the letter shall include a link to join the online class for the programs registered to the applicant.
- III. All new students shall go through the process of verification of their original certificates, diplomas and degrees obtained prior to joining our online classes at the university.

Academic Advisor

All students are advised on the courses they should take by an Advisor assigned to them by the Head of Department. The Advisor-advisee relationship is very important to the curriculum of OCUEA. The Advisor assists the students in planning and executing the students' course of study in conformity with the requirements of each programme. Each student is responsible for completing the requirements of the programme.

REGISTRATION

All students must register for courses online using the student's portal and must have a full load as specified in the templates provided by the School.

Unregistered students will not have access to university services.

The following applies to registration:

- a. The name in which a student will be registered will be that which appears on the student's high school certificate or equivalent document offered as an entry qualification. Where this differs from the student's National ID or Passport, the ID or Passport will be taken and valid explanation provided such as affidavit or marriage certificate.
- b. Registration of continuing students is provided for in the academic programs and is open at any time of convenience to the student.
- c. The student's registration for each program of study is to be planned in consultation with the assigned Advisor. Students are held responsible for seeing that they meet all requirements for graduation. Students not strictly following the curriculum roadmap, thus taking courses out of sequence, forfeit their right to require the school to offer courses when they need them and may not be eligible for graduation at the expected time.
- d. Fees must be paid by the first two weeks of the program registration unless Fee Payment Plan has been submitted to the Office of the Director of Finance.

All students who have not met their financial obligations by the end of 2nd week of the study program are automatically deregistered from the course until such a time as they can comply.

STUDYING ONLINE

No student has to wait for a full year or semester to start with studies. Different people study at different paces which means a student can now determine and maintain his or her own pace.

Students can register any time of the year as and when it suits the student best in terms of own circumstances, whether it be available funds, job requirements or any other circumstances.

Our online learning programs serve students who:

- are unable to attend a Church-based Bible college in their city
- are pursuing a degree, but need to complete some courses through distance delivery

Online education brings the college with all its resources right into your home which you can access at any time of your choosing.

We have listed a number of advantages of online learning:

Flexibility - You can access your course materials at any time of the day and night and from anywhere in the world, as long as you have internet access and a computer or similar device that has internet accessibility. We can also post your books to you if you choose this option.

Convenience - Campus classes are rigid whereas online study can be scheduled around work and family as long as you are disciplined and put in the necessary hours of work required for the online classes.

Access to instructors - you can email your instructor at any time with any question and have your questions answered promptly. You are the only person competing for the instructor's attention.

Cost saving – Studying online will save you time and money by eliminating the need to travel to and from campus. The campus is right where you happen to be at any time.

Access to the world - Every quality resource that you may need to help you complete your classes is available on the internet. The internet can take you to far-flung places across the globe and connect you with unique pieces of information that may not be accessible in the traditional on-campus environment.

Global reach - Online study will place you in contact with other students from all over the world from different cultures which will give you an insight to other worldviews, which will allow help with your personal growth.

TRANSFER OF CREDITS FROM ANOTHER INSTITUTION

- I. (i) An applicant from a recognized institution of higher learning wishing to transfer credits from an uncompleted programme may request advanced placement when he or she applies for admission. The applicant shall complete the Transfer of Credit Form and submit it to the Head of Department, justifying his/her request and attaching evidence of the credentials such as official transcript and course syllabi, which would support such a request. The Head of Department in consultation with the Dean of School shall consider the request. A complete assessment of the applicant's programme requirements and prescription of a curriculum roadmap should be done prior to enrolment at OCUEA or within the first semester. (ii) Equivalent course credits with a minimum grade of B, earned at other recognized institutions shall be accepted at full value to the extent that the courses are comparable to OCUEA requirements. The courses must also be taken within the time limit of seven years prior to admission at OCUEA. (iii) The transferred credits shall not be more than 49% of the credit hours in the OCUEA programme of study.
- II. Although transfer credits are included in the total credits acquired, they shall not be computed into the student's cumulative average score.
- III. No credit shall be given from undergraduate courses towards postgraduate level courses.
- IV. Applicants who have earned a Diploma recognized by OCUEA Senate, may earn credits towards OCUEA Bachelor's degrees to a maximum of 38%.

The student shall be charged transfer of credit fees for initiating the credit transfer process.

LEGAL STATUS AND ACCREDITATION

OCUEA is a non-governmental accreditation, extended exclusively to private, Christian institutions upon inspection and approval of their programs, operations, and integrity and is becoming one of the largest religious accreditation agencies worldwide and accredits other Christian Universities, Theological Seminaries and Bible Schools in over 30 nations. We are registered as Open Christian University in California, USA.

The purpose of accreditation is to:

- *certify that an institution has met the established standards of excellence*
- *assist prospective students in identifying reputable institutions, which offer degree programs that will meet their needs and goals allow institutions to evaluate the acceptability of transfer credits into their own curricula programs*

Accreditation is a private, voluntary, non-governmental peer-review process that reviews the educational quality of an institution or program. In the United States, accreditation is the primary means of assuring educational quality. Accreditation status confirms that an institution has voluntarily undergone a comprehensive self-study and peer examination that demonstrates the institution meets standards of accreditation. To receive accreditation, the institution must clearly demonstrate that it has established educational goals, offers formal, organized learning experiences and services that enable students to meet these stated goals and that students and graduates have benefited from the learning experiences provided. Furthermore, accreditation assures that an institution operates on a sound financial basis, has approved programs of study, qualified instructors, adequate facilities and

equipment and engages in continual improvement through self-evaluation and planning and promotes its programs truthfully.

A degree is only valid if it is properly granted by an entity that has the legal authority to do so and degree-granting authorization cannot be conferred by an accrediting body. Accreditation agencies are themselves private membership associations and relied upon by many governmental entities to perform certain qualitative and evaluative functions. However, they do not themselves have the authority to issue degrees nor have the power to authorize the existence of a college or a degree program.

Government-recognized accreditation is not necessary for the religious vocations in which we are equipping our students; and people working in ministry positions do not need a government accredited degree anyway.

Disclaimer Statement

Our courses meet the requirements established by many private, independent, and professional associations. Various regionally or nationally accredited Christian Universities, colleges and seminaries throughout the United States may accept transfer students, credits and degrees from Open Christian University.

Transferability of credits earned at Open Christian University and transferred to another institution is at the discretion of the receiving institution.

All students outside of the USA are considered as online students of Open Christian University of Eastern Africa and are registered at our digital campus as such. In as much as we provide aspects of interdisciplinary studies, we do not prepare our students for secular work or denominational service.

We will seek to provide a sound theological standing from which our students may fulfil their divine purpose and calling.

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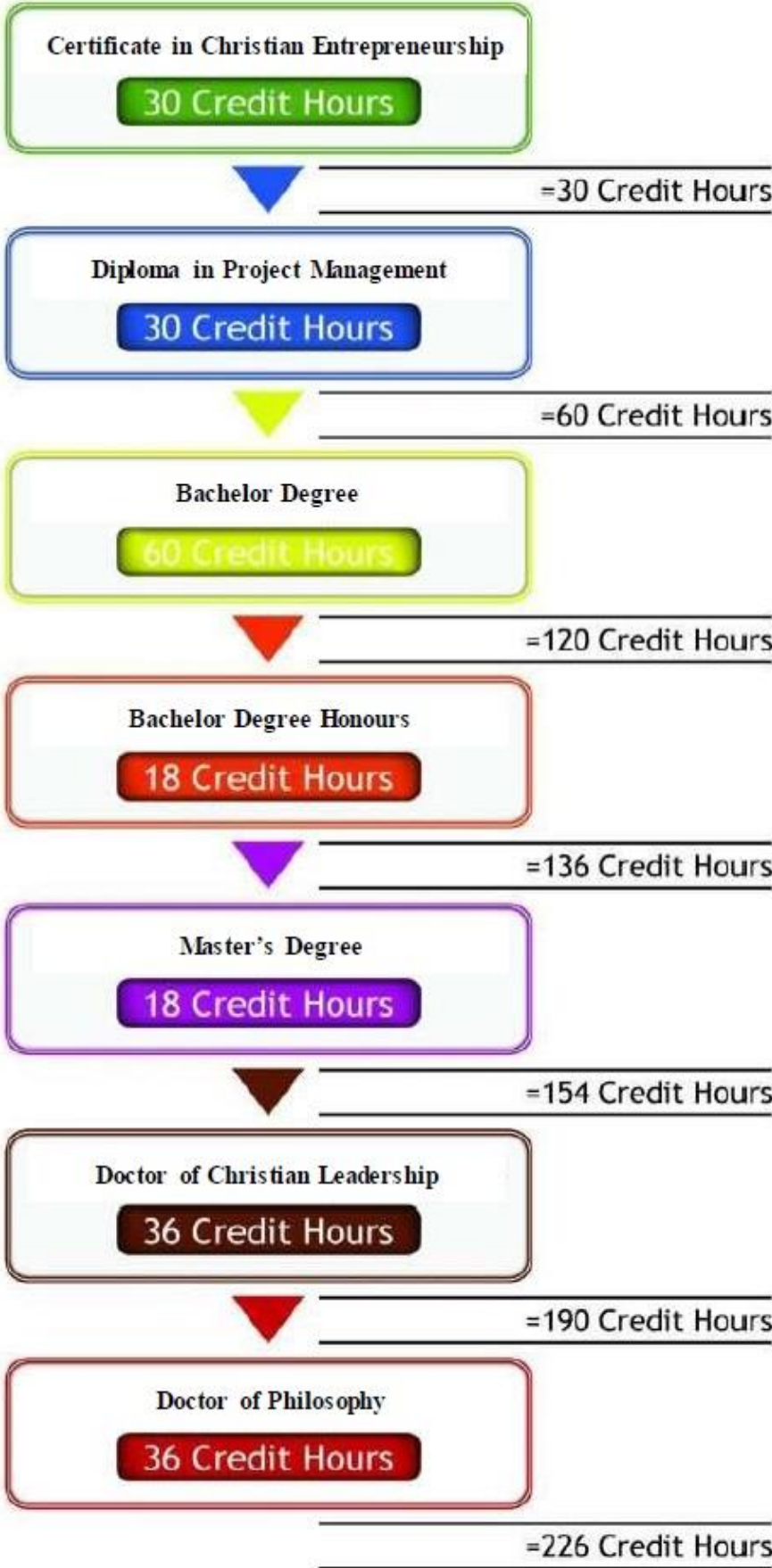

The Associate Degree in Christian Leadership prepares students either for ordained ministry in a Christian church, Bible College or for a wider engagement in society.

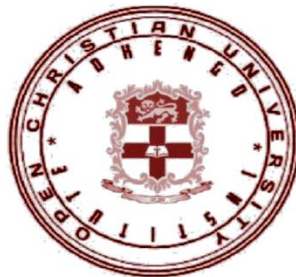
Upon the successful completion of the Associate Degree in Christian Leadership program, the students should be able to:
